In John, LXX and in Philo *Logos* is an agent and an instrument of God's creation. Logos is both divine and created. That matches the Greek thought. However Philo also shows *Logos* in personal terms (just like Meimra and God in the Bible), as a ruler, heir, revealer, ambassador. He walks and talks, he has a will, he becomes flesh in John. This does not line up with Greek thought at all.


